

Lessons in Listening Deeply and Sharing Effectively

Mark 4:1-25

Mark 4:1-9 (NLT)

¹Once again Jesus began **teaching** by the lakeshore. A very large crowd soon gathered around him, so he got into a boat. Then he sat in the boat while all the people remained on the shore. ² He taught them by telling many stories in the form of **parables**, such as this one:

³ "Listen! A farmer went out to plant some seed. ⁴ As he scattered it across his field, some of the seed fell on a footpath, and the birds came and ate it. ⁵ Other seed fell on shallow soil with underlying rock. The seed sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow. ⁶ But the plant soon wilted under the hot sun, and since it didn't have deep roots, it died. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns that grew up and choked out the tender plants so they produced no grain. ⁸ Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they sprouted, grew, and produced a crop that was thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted!" ⁹ Then he said, "Anyone with ears to hear should listen and understand."



Ears to Hear

- ⁹ Then he said, "Anyone with ears to hear should listen and understand."
- ¹¹ He replied, "You are permitted to understand the secret of the Kingdom of God"
- ¹³ Then Jesus said to them, "If you can't understand the meaning of this parable, how will you understand all the other parables?
- ¹⁴ The farmer plants seed by taking God's word to others...
- ²⁰ And the seed that fell on good soil represents those who hear and accept God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had been planted!"

²⁴ Then he added, "Pay close attention to what you hear. The closer you listen, the more understanding you will be given—and you will receive even more. ²⁵ To those who listen to my teaching, more understanding will be given. But for those who are not listening, even what little understanding they have will be taken away from them."




Mark 4:10-12 (NIV)

¹⁰ When he was alone, the Twelve and the others around him asked him about the parables. ¹¹ He told them, "The secret of the kingdom of God has been given to you. But to **those on the outside** everything is said in **parables** ¹² so that,

"they may be **ever seeing** but **never perceiving**, and ever **hearing** but **never understanding**; otherwise they might turn and be forgiven!"






Mark 4:10-12 (The Message)


¹⁰⁻¹² ... "You've been given insight into God's kingdom—you know how it works. But to those who can't see it yet, everything comes in stories, creating readiness, nudging them toward a welcome awakening. These are people—

Whose eyes are open but don't see a thing, Whose ears are open but don't understand a word, Who avoid making an about-face and getting forgiven."



Remez = Hint

Isaiah 6:8-11 (NIV)

⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"

And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

⁹He said, "Go and tell this people:

"Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving."
¹⁰ Make the heart of this people calloused; make their ears dull and close their eyes.
Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts,
and turn and be healed."

¹¹ Then I said, "For how long, Lord?"



Not everyone is ready to hear the same word.

Sometimes people need to go on a journey before they are ready to hear the unfiltered word.

Mark 4:14-20 (NLT)

¹⁴ The farmer plants **seed** by taking **God's word** to others. ¹⁵ The seed that fell on the **footpath** represents those who hear the message, only to have Satan come at once and take it away. ¹⁶ The seed on the rocky soil represents those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy. ¹⁷ But since they **don't have deep roots**, they don't last long. They **fall away** as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word. ¹⁸ The seed that fell among the thorns represents others who hear God's word, ¹⁹ but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the worries of this life, the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things, so no fruit is produced.²⁰ And the seed that fell on good soil represents those who hear and accept God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had been planted!"
