The following questions are designed to help groups explore the message above by challenging participants to consider how God is wanting them to apply it to their lives.

The questions are a **quide** to help lead discussion.

Please don't feel that all questions need to be asked, instead respond to the needs of your group.

If you have new people in your group, take the opportunity to introduce each other and clarify any expectations that are present in your group (such as confidentiality).

GETTING STARTED

- 1. What are some of the ways that you have been, or have seen others set up to succeed when being trained?
- 2. What was the main challenge or idea that stood out to you from the message on Sunday?

REFLECTING ON THE MESSAGE

Key Scriptures: Mark 6:7-13 (Read Mark 6:7-13)

- 1. Why does Jesus send His disciples out to the nearby villages and towns? What does it reveal about who Jesus is?
- 2. In verse 7, Jesus gives the disciples authority and sends them out in pairs because He wants them to bear witness of what they have seen.
 - a. If you were one of the 12 disciples; what are some of the things you would be sharing?
 - b. How would you bear witness to what Jesus has done in your life?
- 3. Jesus' instructions of what to take and not take were to encourage the disciples to look for people of peace and where God is already at work.
 - a. How do you pay attention / or notice where God is at work?
 - b. Where have you seen God at work around you lately?
- 4. Jesus gives His disciples permission to move on where people are not ready to hear the message
 - a. How does this idea make you feel?
 - b. Can you think of examples in your life where you have needed that permission? What happened?

RESPONDING TO THE MESSAGE

- 1. Which of these ideas resonate with you at the moment? Why?
- 2. What do you need to do about it?
