Home Group Discussion Guide for When What We Can Offer Is Small...

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The following questions are designed to help groups explore the message above by challenging participants to consider how God is wanting them to apply it to their lives.

The questions are a **guide** to help lead discussion.

Please don't feel that all questions need to be asked, instead respond to the needs of your group.

If you have new people in your group, take the opportunity to introduce each other and clarify any expectations that are present in your group (such as confidentiality).

GETTING STARTED

- How far have you travelled to hear someone share? (Maybe a band, a comedian, a speaker)

 Who were they and why did you see them?
- 2. What was the main challenge or idea that stood out to you from the message on Sunday?

REFLECTING ON THE MESSAGE

Key Scriptures: Mark 6:30-44; Psalm 23

(Read Mark 6:30-44)

- 1. As you read this passage, what stands out to you about it? Why?
- 2. Can you relate to feeling that the problems you face are too big and the resources you have inadequate?
 - a. How do you respond in this situation?
- 3. God used the small amount that was offered What are some examples you have seen of God using the small, seemingly inadequate offerings we bring?
- 4. Mark links this passage back to Psalm 23. What is He trying to help us understand about Jesus?
- 5. Is there a truth in who Jesus is that brings you comfort and hope at the moment? Why?

RESPONDING TO THE MESSAGE

- 1. What is something small, or 'inadequate' that you can offer to God?
- 2. What would it look like for Him to multiply that?
- 3. Where or How will you offer that this week?
