





Mark 6:48b

ESV He meant to pass by them.

KJV and would have passed by them.

MSG He intended to go right by them.

NLT He intended to go past them.

YLT and wished to pass by them.

Greek: ἤθελεν παρελθεῖν

(thelen parelthein)

- 1. to will, have in mind, intend
- 2. to be resolved or determined,
- 3. to desire, to wish
- 4. to like to do a thing, be fond of doing
- 5. to take delight in, have pleasure

1. to go past, pass by

IN OUR FEAR, EXHAUSTION, CONFUSION:

Jesus reminds us who he is. He climbs in the boat with us.

In the instruction, in the struggle, in the fear...

Do you understand the loaves?



v34 – the crowd gathered

v35-36 – everyone needed to eat

v37 – You feed them. But we can't.

v38 – five loaves and two fish

v39-40 – Jesus directed the people to sit down in groups on the green grass

v41 – five loaves and two fish

v42 – You feed them. They can.

v43 – everyone ate and there was leftovers

v45-46 – the crowd was dismissed



Psalm 23:1-4

- ¹ The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing.
- ² He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters,
- ³ He refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake.
- ⁴ Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, **for you are with me**; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

THE LESSON OF THE LOAVES

In your suffering, the **promise** <u>isn't</u> that Jesus will always swoop in and save the day...

He may (in divine power) feed the crowd, or He may (in divine power) keep walking past

...but he is always the Good Shepherd who is with us in those struggles.
