


Who Let the Dogs In?






"I don't want the **after-dinner** leftovers, I'll take the crumbs available **now**."

"Lord," she replied, "even the dogs under the table eat the children's **crumbs**." (Mark 7:28)






Do you make requests of God with both humility and hunger?

⁶ "Do not give dogs what is sacred; do not throw your pearls to pigs. If you do, they may trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you to pieces.




Matthew 7:6-9
